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Schools must place students in the Least Restrictive Environment (LRE). That means students must be placed in the general education setting to the greatest extent appropriate and receive supports and services to ensure the student receives FAPE (Free Appropriate Public Education).

This online workshop examines these two concepts and how they apply to your child. With appropriate supports and services, students with disabilities benefit from meaningful interactions and learning experiences in the Least Restrictive Environment.

- Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) must be provided by schools to eligible students through programs and services to meet the student's unique needs and provide educational benefit.
- Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) is the setting where a child with a disability can receive an appropriate education designed to meet his or her educational needs, alongside peers without disabilities to the maximum extent appropriate.
