

# **Supporting Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) at Home**

## 5 Tips

### 1. Find your team

- Ask your child's IEP team for support including pictures and/or videos of them using the device at school so you can see how they are using it
- Ask family members and friends to learn along with you
- Connect with others via social media

#### 2. Get Comfortable

- o Helpful things to know about your child's AAC tool
  - How to turn it on/off
  - Volume control
  - Does it need batteries or charging
  - How to record or program new words
  - Where to find your child's favorite things
- How to learn
  - Explore on your own
  - Try to find words your child uses often
  - Try singing a favorite song or saying a line from a movie your child enjoys
  - Ask staff for videos of them using the device

#### 3. Customize

- Things that can be customized
  - Skin tone, voice, pictures of people, icons
- How to customize
  - Ask a team member to show you how
  - Request things be changed/added
  - How to tutorials on youtube/company's website

## 4. Accept all forms of communication

- Encourage your child to use their device
- Accept gestures, vocalizations, pointing, body language, without requiring your child use the device

#### 5. Model

- Model complete messages
- Let the device speak first
- Model for connection , not correction
- Model through mistakes
- Steps for AAC Modeling
  - Join in or invite attention
  - Model a complete message using AAC
  - Wait
  - Recognize any response as their turn
  - Model again if there's no response
  - End when the child ends it
